 - a. In the case of a first offense, the student may write a letter to the Superintendent requesting an appeal. An appeal may be granted in which the student must complete 20 hours of community service as assigned by the superintendent and serve ten days suspension from all activities. (*The student will be suspended from practice for 10 days as sanctioned by the Alaska School Activities Association or five days if the student completes the First Offense educational component as outlined in the ASAA Handbook. Upon fulfilling the ASAA practice suspension requirements, 10 days or 5 days, the student must return to full practice obligations.*) The student must also complete the ASAA First Offense educational component as outlined in the ASAA Handbook prior to returning to practice.
