Dahl Memorial Clinic: Shelly Moss and Carol Borg

- Will provide annual field trips and material to learn about x-ray, ultrasound, and phlebotomy.
- Will also explore ways to incorporate student learning in public health issues (domestic violence task force, immunization education, etc.)

KHNS: Leslie Ross

- Are open to providing instruction and time for students to learn about radio production, news writing, and on air talent. Currently not sure how much time they can commit.
- Will provide students with computer with production software already installed.
- Two people in Skagway (Jim Devereaux and Mark Larsen who could assist with instruction)
- Open to students making trips to Haines to work in the studio and for instruction
- Would be interested in partnering with students to produce PSAs for topical issues.

Skagway Newspaper: Jeff Brady

Tayia Inlet Watershed Council: Rachael Ford

- Currently developing curriculum for January on Salmon for elementary wing
- Open to partnering with high school science class on hydro carbon testing in Pullen Creek.

National Park Service: Mike Tranel

- Opportunities for OJT and projects in:
 - o Natural Resources (Natural science studies)
 - o Cultural Resources (Archeology)
 - o History (Working with Park Historian)
 - o Administration (Public Policy)
 - o Maintenance (Construction and Maintenance)
- NPS is able to obtain curriculum for high school training in natural sciences, archeology, and history.

Consulate of Japan in Anchorage

- Multiple programs to bring a Japanese teacher to Skagway to teach the Japanese language and culture
 - o J-LEAP (Japanese Language Assistant Program)
 - o Japanese-Language Educational Grant (Japan Foundation Los Angeles)
 - o Japanese Language Education Overseas (Japan Foundation Tokyo)

Consulate of Norway in Anchorage

- Consulate was unsure of any current programs, but would need a letter requesting information from school for him to proceed with his department of education.
