Executive Session: The Board reserves the right to enter into executive session on any agenda item as provided for in State Law. Executive sessions will be entered into by motion and approved by a majority of the Board for discussion of the following subjects as permitted by law: (1) matters the immediate knowledge of which would clearly have an adverse effect upon the finances of the District; (2) subjects that tend to prejudice the reputation and character of any person, provided that the person may request a public discussion; (3) matters which by law, municipal charter, or ordinance are required to be confidential or (4) matters involving consideration of government records that by law are not subject to public disclosure. Motions to go into executive session should specify the subject of the proposed executive session without defeating the purpose of addressing the subject in private.

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- 1) Provide for the identification of future agenda items at a specific time during board meetings. An item will require a second for discussion. The agenda item will be scheduled for future work sessions.

- 2) Inform the superintendent of specific concerns members hear from parents or community members. The superintendent should let the full board know of the response or outcome of the issue.

Vision

In partnership with educators, family and community; Skagway School District will provide rich and rigorous academics that ensure all students will succeed in their education and work.

Mission

Skagway School District will:

1. Skagway School District will sponsor:

 - b. Annual community barbeque with school orientation for new families.
2. The Skagway School Board will establish a subcommittee consisting of board members, staff, student, parent, and private citizen to focus on internal and external communications. This subcommittee will develop a formal communication plan by August 1st

3. The Skagway School District will ensure the resources for professional development and continuing education.
4. The Skagway School District will establish a formalized hiring committee and process.

Goal Three: The Skagway School District will set and meet high expectations for academic achievement, teaching standards, administration accomplishments, and board performance.

1. The Skagway School District will develop and adopt a new evaluation tool for the Superintendent position that contains measurable objectives, and input from the staff and community.
2. The Skagway School District will pilot the research-based system to evaluate teacher and superintendent performance and promote professional growth in the 2014-2015 school year.
3. The Skagway School District will produce a study to measure student success after graduation.
4. The Skagway School District will provide professional guidance counselor services.

Goal Four: The Skagway School District will maintain and improve the School District's ability to keep students healthy and safe.

1. The Skagway School District will ensure funding and advocacy for early intervention and vision/hearing services.
2. The Skagway School District will ensure Child Find happens annually.
